April 11, 2016 Courses Day 1

New Mexico Electric Code

The seminar will address the requirements of the New Mexico Electrical Code, and will be presented by Michal Savage

This course will be presented in the Morning session

New Mexico Accessibility Code

This seminar will address the applicable requirements for accessibility and ADA requirements. The course will be presented by the Governor's Council on Disabilities

The course will be in the Afternoon session

Inspector Skills:

(Full Day .6 ICC CEU)

This seminar address the necessary soft skills for success as an inspector, those technical traits and behaviors that enhance an inspector's ability to interact with others and to successfully carry out their job duties. These include people skills such as effective communication, diplomacy and customer service, but also include skills for problem solving, professionalism, integrity, and time management. In addition to a solid understanding of the technical provisions of the codes, developing appropriate soft skills are essential in pursuing the goal of safe, healthy and durable building for the community. Developed specifically for construction inspectors in all disciplines. Topics include:

- Principals of code administration for achieving safe buildings
- General approaches to inspection
- Getting along
- Customer service
- Ethics

April 12, 2016 Courses Day 2

2015 IBC Significant Changes:

(Full Day .6 ICC CEU)

This seminar reviews and analyzes selected significant changes from the 2012 International Building Code (IBC) to the 2015 IBC. It familiarizes building officials, fire officials, plans examiners, inspectors and design professionals with many of the significant changes in the 2015 IBC. It also assists code users in identifying the specific code changes that have occurred and understanding the reason behind the change. Finally, it focuses on those code changes selected due to their frequency of application, special significance or change in application. This course uses the Significant Changes to the International Building Code 2015 Edition.

2015 ICC Commercial Cooking Systems

(1/2 day .3 ICC CEU)

This seminar will address the applicable requirements in the 2015 IMC, IFC, IFGC, IBC, and IECC as applicable to commercial cooking systems. It emphasis commercial hood and duct construction, when commercial hoods are required, what type of hood is required for different cooking appliances, and air movement requirements for commercial cooking systems.

This course will be presented in the Morning session

Round Table with New Mexico Fire Marshal's Office

A round table discussion to discuss the requirements for Commercial Hood extinguishing systems, and what each agency requires. The purpose of the discussion to develop consistent requirements throughout the state specifically for mobile food venders, and possible develop a course for those requirements.
